Funding Information Network locations also hold training sessions on how to effectively use these resources and identify potential funders.

Thousands of people visit Foundation Center's website each day and are served in its five regional learning centers and its international partnerships with hundreds of Funding Information Network locations.

The Eastern Shore Public Library is working with the Eastern Shore of Virginia Community Foundation, the United Way of Virginia's Eastern Shore, and the Eastern Shore of Virginia Chamber of Commerce to build the capacity of nonprofits on the Shore. The ESVA Community Foundation has provided the financial support for the Foundation Center databases. A United Way donor has provided funding for the computer designated for searching these databases. The Chamber is assisting with training and additional resources.
