Eastern Shore Public Library Hosts Virginia Museum of Fine Arts Exhibit



The Eastern Shore Public Library is hosting an educational exhibit, **“Uncovering Home: A Visual Essay on Jamestown Archaeology,”** on loan from the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond. What’s new on Jamestown Island? Archaeologists from the Jamestown Rediscovery project at Historic Jamestowne are uncovering James Fort’s oldest artifacts, and creating a revised picture of life in the first permanent English settlement in America! This limited security exhibition is perfect for schools, libraries, and art centers.

The exhibition’s 12 panels paint a vivid picture of the struggles of the early colonists, while illustrating critical processes of historical archaeology. Are you looking for ways to generate enthusiasm for SOL-related Virginia history, science, and math? Come see this exhibition!

The exhibit will be at the library in Accomac from April 19th to June 27th and viewable during hours of operation. There is no cost to view the exhibit. Plans are underway to extend the tour to Northampton Memorial Library in Nassawadox.

Eastern Shore Public Library has become a “statewide partner” with VMFA, making the library system eligible for their touring exhibits and speakers. Community, schools, homeschool, and church groups are invited to tour the exhibit and are encouraged to make reservations for general library tours or a corresponding program.
