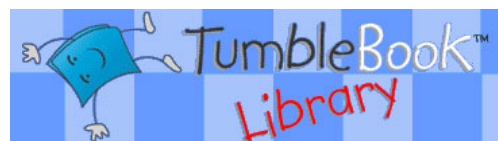
Spanish Language materials available!

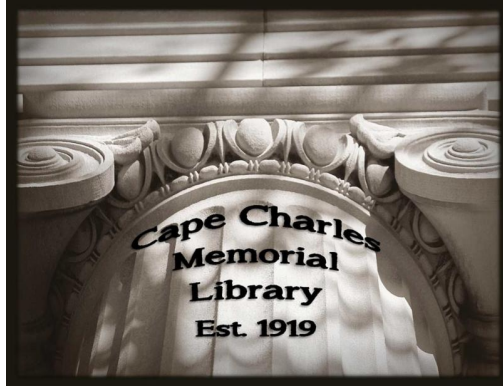
