

To Be Sold: Virginia and the American Slave Trade offers a frank exploration of Virginia's role in the business of the second middle passage—the forced relocation of two-thirds of a million African Americans from the Upper South to the Cotton South in the decades before the Civil War.

Miss Wheeler was a puckish maiden lady from Chicago and Tony Cerasoli was outwardly a bit of a "grumpy grouse."




