

Chincoteague Island Library
Monthly Update for ESPL Trustees' Meeting

Our board is in the process of putting together a slate of officers for 2020 and updating the board list.

Maintenance: The handicapped ramp and side porch stairs and railings have been painted.

Donor Recognition: A small plaque naming Travis Birch who died in 2010 has been placed in the Young Adult section of the library. Additionally, the 2017/18 Honor Wall plaque has been hung on the exterior of the library by the book drop.

We have received a \$25,000 Endowment Challenge from a Chincoteague resident to match funds by December 31, 2019. We have raised close to \$9,000 to date.

Programs:

Computer Programs which is partially funded by the United Way has been very successful. Several refurbished laptops were donated. Microsoft Office 365 was added to them. We are currently teaching Excel to students. Courses will run through February and are held in the Theatre Annex (across from the library) at 4 p.m. on Thursdays.

Children's Programs: Fall **Tales 4 Tots** has 2 more programs. Winter/Spring **Tales 4 Tots** will begin on January 9 and will run every Thursday at 10 a.m. through May.

We will be working soon on our Summer programs and would appreciate it if the other libraries would let us know well in advance about their paid performances.

Reading award certificates and \$10 gift certificates to the Book Fair were handed out to 12 (2 students from each grade from K – 5 at the Chincoteague Elementary School at the school's award ceremony. We will be doing this quarterly.

Saturday, November 30, the Library participated in the Town's Annual Tree Lighting. Following the program, which was held on our porch, Santa Claus came into the library so the children could talk to him and tell him what they wanted for Christmas. Each child received a candy cane.

We also participated in the Downtown Merchants' Association's Home for the Holidays House Tour as a place of interest at the event, which was held on Friday, December 6 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
